CORPUS CHRISTI

Looking Out for Number 1

When Jesus said the words, "This is my body..This is my blood of the covenant," it was the night before he died. He knew he was going to give his life for us. By letting them drink the wine and eat the bread, he was inviting them to a new covenant, a new agreement with God. Did they really believe that they were eating and drinking his body and blood? Did they really know that he would die on the cross the next day?

Sometimes we may think of religion as something not quite real. When we think that a loving God would never let disasters happen, or that we can escape from our problems into prayer, or that "looking out for number 1" is the only practical way to live, then we miss the point of the Eucharist. Every time we celebrate Mass, "we proclaim the death of the Lord," as St. Paul says. By receiving his Body and Blood, we accept not only the reality of Jesus' death, but also share in his cross.

Jesus died on the cross because it was the Father's will. It showed both how much he loves us, that he would die for us, and also showed how to accept suffering we cannot avoid. Even while we work to relieve suffering in the world, we know that Jesus' suffering lead to eternal life. Our faith is never an excuse to ignore suffering, but we also must never see suffering as a sign of God's punishment. God allows suffering to continue when he can bring greater good from it. For example, if I see someone hurting and I help them, they may see God's love in my support and I can learn to see Jesus in them.

When we receive Jesus in communion, we are accepting the covenant that God made through the death of his Son. United with Jesus in the Eucharist, we begin to say, "This is MY body which is given up for Jesus." As we drink the Precious Blood, we pledge to pour out our lives for each other. We look out for a new "Number 1" Jesus, the Lord of all.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord. I hope that this annual celebration of the Lord's Body and Blood given to us in the Holy Eucharist will stir up our hearts in gratitude for this tremendous Gift from God. As Catholics we are blessed to be able to go to Mass and receive the Holy Eucharist even every day. Of course, we know that we must never take this great Gift for granted and we must receive It in a state of grace. The maximum respect and veneration of this Sacrament should be shown because the Eucharist is nothing less than God with us!! Recently at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome the Holy Father has begun asking that people receive the Eucharist in the traditional posture, that is, while kneeling and on the tongue. We started doing so here at Sts. Peter and Paul at the 12:10 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Masses at the beginning of Lent. There was no problem in administering the Holy Eucharist in this manner and with the Bishop's permission we will continue to do so. Those who are unable to kneel because of physical limitations are welcomed to simply stand at the altar rail for reception of the Sacrament. Those who can kneel do so at the rail on both sides of the aisle while the priest comes to them. Everyone receives on the tongue. People have a moment to kneel in adoration while the priest administers the Communion to the others. Afterwards those who wish to receive the Precious Blood proceed to the Extraordinary Minister and receive the Precious Blood while standing. Both Father Elkin and myself are very open to doing so at the other Masses as well but we are awaiting a sign that our community is ready for such a change. At the 9:30 a.m. and 12:10 p.m. Masses this Sunday there will be a brief procession with the Blessed Sacrament after Mass to show special honor and devotion to Our Lord on this solemn Feast. Please remember that the Church is open Monday through Friday starting at 3:00 p.m. for Adoration. Coming to adoration is a great help to developing a strong devotion toward the Blessed Sacrament. I would love to see more people come to take advantage of the opportunity to pray before the Doctor of our Souls and sign up to take a particular hour each week. Having an appointment with the King of Kings and Lord of Lords each week is such a privilege. Just call Gayle in the parish office if you are able to take a weekly holy hour. In doing so you assist the community to keep the doors open because we cannot have the adoration program unless there is always someone present so as to ensure that the Sacrament is kept safe from profanation.

After the 9:30 a.m. and 12:10 p.m. Masses this Sunday we will have a special reception for Father Elkin to celebrate his first anniversary of priesthood. He is great help to all of us here at the parish and I hope that everyone will come and let him know how much we appreciate all his efforts. The receptions will be held in the cafeteria. By Divine Providence we are also beginning the Year of the Priesthood this very week. Actually the date will be Friday June 19th, the Feast of the Sacred Heart. Pope Benedict has declared a year of the priest to mark the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, whom he is proclaiming "patron of all priests". Let us respect and honor the holy priesthood of Our Lord Jesus Christ that Fr. Elkin and indeed all priests

participate in sacramentally. Even though priests are men of flesh and blood they are configured to Jesus Christ and because of that reality they act in the very person of Christ!! Indeed they change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of the Lord and they forgive sins!! Christ works through the priest in such a way that He exercises His holy Priesthood through them!! Let us pray for priests every day and let us also pray that the Lord Jesus Christ continue to give men the grace to accept this holy and sublime vocation with humility and reverence.

On Wednesday, June 17th we will begin our monthly novena to St. Toribio Romo following the evening Mass. Devotion to this martyr who was also a priest of Jesus Christ continues to grow among the immigrants as was attested to by our recent Procession and Carnival to mark his Feast Day. St. Toribio had a preoccupation that many people who were leaving from Mexico during the anti-Catholic persecutions that occurred in the 1920's and 1930's and were heading north would encounter difficulty in living out their Catholic faith. Indeed this seems to be very much the case today as Mexican immigrants face the challenges of remaining Catholic in a mostly protestant environment. Indeed they are sometimes ridiculed and despised even by their own fellow Catholics. The monthly novena that we do at our parish gives us an opportunity to pray for the needs of the immigrants who are sometime overwhelmed with many, many difficulties.

Please come to honor our Divine Lord on Friday of this week when we gather together for the weekly adoration before the Blessed Sacrament at 6:00 p.m. There will be a Mass at 7:00 p.m. and following the Mass another hour of Adoration and Reparation toward the Sacred Heart of Jesus on His solemn Feast Day. As the Year of the Priest begins let us come together in a spirit of prayer and gratitude for the Priesthood of Jesus Christ through which we receive all that we need to be saved.

Also, on Saturday of this week there will be a day long retreat here at the parish for anyone who wishes to participate. The retreat will begin at 8:30 a.m. with the Mass of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and will conclude at 4:00 p.m. There will be breakfast and lunch available to all. But, please let us know in the office if you plan to attend.

Following the 5:00 p.m. Mass next Saturday there will be a group from Bethlehem selling religious articles to benefit the Christians in the Holy Land. Please come prepared if you wish to purchase one of their items.

Finally, beginning this Friday at 8:15 a.m. we will have a Novena to St. Paul to mark the end of the Year of St. Paul. Since he is one of our patron saints I thought it would be good to pray a special Novena to him for our parish and for our personal needs. Father Mario Palma Garcia will be here on Saturday and he will lead a Novena in the evening following the 7:00p.m. Mass. He will also offer a day long retreat in Spanish on June 27th in preparation for the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. More information will be forthcoming.

Have a great week and God bless you on this Holy Day! May Our Lord Jesus Christ give us all a deeper love and reverence for Him in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood.

Words regarding handling of the “host”

Blessed Mother Teresa was absolutely right in seeing the connection between a crisis of faith of many Catholics and Communion in the hand.

What is being said about one’s faith and love for the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul of Divinity of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and the perpetuating, in the Sacrifice of the Mass, of Christ’s infinite Sacrifice of the Cross which redeemed us?

It is not being professed if the Sacred Host is handled and looked upon as an ordinary little piece of bread quickly disposed of ??? Think about that deeply. Do you truly believe? Truly? We must always remember that you cannot be a true Catholic without faith in the Eucharist.

To handle or receive the Sacred Host, which is the living Real Presence of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ without the proper reverence and adoration is not only disrespectful, it is the serious sin of sacrilege. One cannot take lightly or handle carelessly the greatest Gift God has given us. Thus, Mother Teresa openly expressed great sorrow when she witnessed people receiving Holy Communion in the hand. Seeing the irreverence and abuses creeping into the divine liturgy, and the various other problems that have been growing in the Church, attributed it all to Communion and to the consequential weakening and loss of true faith. She is now Blessed Mother Teresa, an honor that adds credibility to her warnings.

Ojala que esta celebración anual del Cuerpo y de la Sangre del Señor que están dados a nosotros por medio de la Sagrada Eucaristía anima a nuestros corazones en agradecimiento por este regalo de Dios. Como católicos somos bendecidos porque podemos asistir a la Misa y recibir la Sagrada Eucaristía cada día. Claro, sabemos que nunca debemos dar por sentado este gran Regalo y debemos recibirlo en un estado de gracia. El es una ayuda muy grande aquí en la parroquia y deseo que todos vengan para demostrar nuestro agradecimiento por todo que hace. Las recepciones tendrán lugar en la cafetería. Por Providencia Divina también estamos empezando el Año del Sacerdocio esta semana. Del Vicario

Hace poco veía el concierto que una famosa "pop star" ofrecía en algún lugar de Europa. En medio de la presentación gritaba con una emoción encausada no solo a animar la masa, sino también a generar sentido humano y promover crítica social. Es común, por estos días, que artistas y gente de los medios usen el poder de influencia que poseen para generar conductas positivas en las masas. Que sea como estrategia de promoción personal o por verdadera convicción, es cuestión dejada a sus conciencias, lo cierto es que a veces logran impactar a las multitudes con frases, declaraciones, acciones, y gestos que inspiran y remodelan comportamientos.

Ejemplo de ello son los famosos conciertos "Live 8" en donde las más famosas bandas del momento se juntan por la causa de crear conciencia sobre los problemas actuales del mundo tales como el sida, los efectos de la globalización, la guerra, el hambre, la esclavitud, la pobreza, y otros más cuya lista se nos haría imposible concretar.

En este concierto, la artista decía una frase que aun mantengo en mi memoria: "*Leaders are lacking in love and love is lacking in Leaders.*" (Los líderes carecen de amor, y el amor carece de líderes). El amor hace ver al prójimo como un sujeto valioso, con necesidades y sueños, si así fuera, probablemente no existiría la avaricia que sectoriza los bienes, que monopoliza las riquezas, que hace a unos países y a otros ricos, que hace al político poner sus propios intereses y los de su partido por encima de los del pueblo; el amor no objetiviza, el amor es entrega total y responsable, si así fuera, la promiscuidad dejaría de ser el vehículo por medio del cual se propagan las enfermedades venéreas incluyendo el VIH y miles dejarían de morir cada año; el amor estima al otro, no toma ventaja de él, si así fuera, no habría tráfico de personas, subvaloración de razas, etnocidios, genocidios, prostitución forzada, abuso laboral, violencia doméstica, y otros delitos más, que aunque a baja escala, deberían ser considerados de lesa humanidad.

De esta manera, sería no solo lógico sino también necesario afirmar que los líderes del mundo necesitan amor, y el amor necesita líderes. Lejos del romanticismo pasivo y fantasioso con que a menudo se nos presenta el amor, debemos tomar acción y convertirlo en una experiencia viva que regule nuestras relaciones personales, espirituales, laborales, que tome posesión de nuestro corazón, pasa que así transformemos la sociedad, que tome control de nuestras acciones, nuestros hogares, nuestros vecindarios, e instalemos así la civilización del amor, que es sinónimo del Reino de Dios, y
