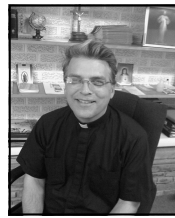

## From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are already up to the third Sunday of Advent. Today we rejoice that Christmas will soon be here. The rose colored vestments signify this joy at the approach of the solemn Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord.

In the parish this week we will begin the Posadas on Tuesday evening, December 16<sup>th</sup>. Every evening at 6:30 p.m. the rosary will be prayed and then will follow the procession, the singing and the smashing of the piñata. The Posadas are a Christmas Novena that includes not only prayer but also a Fiesta that follows the procession. "Posada" signifies "a place to stay". Mary and Joseph's search for a "posada" is what is remembered through prayer and song and this devotion helps the whole family "connect" with the Christmas story. Everyone is welcomed to attend the Posadas or to pray in a similar way in your homes. Basically, the family can come together and pray the rosary and read a little bit of the Christmas story each night from the Gospel and sing some Advent songs together. This should be done for nine nights in a row leading up to Christmas Eve.

This week the school will also be doing their annual "Christmas Production" in the gym. It is always amazing to me how much talent and energy our young children display. The Christmas play will take place on Thursday, December 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. Thanks again to Donna Reneau for her outstanding work with this production. The school will go on Christmas vacation after December 19<sup>th</sup> until January 5<sup>th</sup> of next year.

There are no religious education classes on Tuesday or Wednesday of this week. The next classes will start on January 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. I hope that everyone in our school and religious education apostolates will have a very Merry Christmas and a truly

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS**

The tradition of anointing the sick with blessed oil is very old, but developed slowly and unevenly in the first eight centuries of the church's life. St. Augustine, who wrote volumes of homilies from his thriving church in North Africa, plus pastoral directives, letters and memoirs, never mentions it at all. We know from ancient prayers that it did happen in Rome, Milan, Gaul and the British Isles. In Rome the bishop blessed the oil of the sick, but it could be applied by a priest, deacon or a layperson. It seems that sick persons could even anoint themselves. St. Genevieve of Paris was known for anointing the sick in her care.

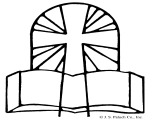
Perhaps inevitably, complaints of abuses, and even trickery by sorcerers, brought an end to this consoling practice. In a dangerous world with a dispersed population, clerics may have preferred that this hands-on care was a lay privilege. The purpose of anointing, however, was not simply healing, but forgiveness of sin and an experience of the saving power of Christ. By the year 800, dioceses everywhere were organizing rituals for a priestly anointing. Although anointing of the sick is reserved to priests today, perhaps this treasured memory will enrich the future of the sacrament.

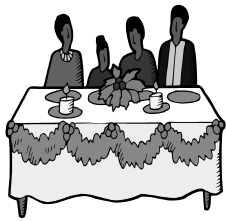

**Pope Francis’  
10 Secrets to Happiness**

Pope Francis, who carries an aura of joy in everything he says and does, has identified ten secrets to happiness that are time-tested and true.

**6. Create jobs for young people.**

We find purpose in our lives through meaningful work; we are encouraged to take that one step further and ensure that young people have what Pope Francis calls “dignified jobs.” We can start the process early in our own families by assigning to our children household chores that teach them the importance of making a contribution to the family. We can involve preteens and adolescents in volunteer service projects where they can use their God-given gifts and talents. “We need to be creative with young people,” the pope urges, “in order to prevent them from slipping into drugs and despair. When we find ways to raise them up, we will discover in them and in ourselves a deeper sense of happiness.”

*How can you help young people find dignity and happiness through meaningful work or service?*

**7. Respect and take care of nature.**

We are the stewards of God’s creation, and we have a responsibility to preserve and protect it - not just for ourselves, but for future generations - including clean air and water, wetlands and forests, and farm lands and natural resources. Pope Francis asks the question: “Isn’t humanity committing suicide with this indiscriminate and tyrannical use of nature?” We can start in our own homes, schools, and work places by recycling, reusing, and cutting back on pollutants and waste. Our personal campaign to respect and care for nature brings happiness, because we know that we are taking time and important steps to respect and preserve our environment.

**8. Stop being negative.**

constant complaining, biting criticism, backstabbing, and gossip are like poisons that kill happiness. “Needing to talk badly about others indicates low self-esteem,” Pope Francis explains. “That means, I feel so low that instead of picking myself up, I have to cut others down.” It’s not easy to change from being negative to being positive. the first step is awareness that being negative or positive is a personal choice. The second step is making a concerted effort to stop ourselves from negative thoughts and words as soon as possible. “Letting go of negative things is healthy,” the Pope adds, and it leads to a more positive and a happier outlook on life.

*What steps can you take to eliminate negativity in your life?*

**9. Respect others’ beliefs.**

We all have family members, friends and acquaintances who do not share our Catholic beliefs. Yet, nagging and pressuring will not bring happiness for anyone. “We can inspire others through witness so that one grows together in communicating,” Pope Francis explains. When we live as authentic witnesses to Christ, other people are attracted by the inner peace and joy that emanate from us. They want that peace and joy for themselves. Whether or not they ever come to share our beliefs, when we treat them with respect, we create a bond of happiness between us. by Lorene Hanley Duquin, Copyright Our Sunday Visitor

**TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE**

Jesús proclama que Juan el Bautista es más que un profeta (Lucas 7:26) y lo compara con Elías, el profeta más importante de los judíos (Mateo 17:11-13). Pero, ¿qué es un profeta? El judaísmo, cristianismo e islamismo reconocen a ciertas personas como profetas. La palabra hebrea *nabi* significa portavoz, o profeta. Los *nebiim* eran encargados por Dios para una tarea especial. Así por ejemplo, Moisés fue encargado para liberar al pueblo de la esclavitud egipcia, Elías para recordarle la palabra de Dios cuando se apartaba de la alianza, y Jeremías para denunciar las corrupciones y anunciarle el castigo. cuando tradujeron al griego el Antiguo Testamento, la palabra *nabi* fue traducida como prophetes (profeta). Esto indica un intérprete de la voluntad de Dios. Los profetas griegos eran oráculos que adivinaban el futuro, por la cual mucha gente confunde el profeta con un adivino. El profeta según el cristianismo es un testigo (Juan 1:6-8, 19-28) del poder de Cristo y la palabra de Dios.
