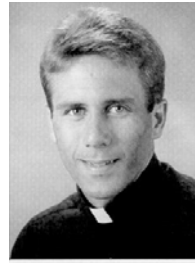

From the Pastor

Why Latin and the Latin Mass?

“The Latin language provides a bond that unites throughout the world, a weapon of orthodoxy against all the subtleties of the sectarian spirit, and a most powerful arm of the papacy...” Dom Prosper Gueranger, “The Anti-liturgical Heresy”.

“For the Church, Precisely because it embraces all nations and is destined to endure until the end of time... Of its very nature requires a language that is universal, immutable, and non-vernacular.” Pope Pius XI.

“The use of the Latin Language prevailing in a great part of the Church affords at once an imposing sign of unity and an effective safeguard against the corruptions of true doctrine.” Pope Pius XII.

“Latin is the immutable language of the Western Church.” Pope Saint John XXIII.

“ The use of the Latin language... is to be preserved in the Latin rites... in accordance with the age-old tradition of the Latin rite, the Latin language is to be retained by clerics in the Devine Office...” Vatican II, Sacrosanctum Concilium.

“We exhort all of you to lift up high the torch of Latin which is even today a bond of unity among peoples of all nations...” Pope Saint John Paul II.

The traditional Latin Mass is celebrated in the ancient and venerable language of the Catholic Church. The Latin language provides a sense of mystery and sacredness. We often hear Latin referred to as a “dead” language because it is no longer spoken in the vernacular language in any country today. But the Mass is offered in Latin precisely because Latin words do not change in meaning. Pope Pius XII explains: “The use of the Latin language is a manifest and beautiful sign of unity, as well as an effective anecdote for any corruption of doctrininal truth.”

The priest does not face the congregation during Latin Mass, but turns toward Christ in the tabernacle along with the rest of the worshippers. He makes no spontaneous comments on his own, but rather recites the same prayers that priests have used for centuries! The priest alone touches the sacred host with his ordained hands. One kneels before our Lord and Savior in order to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. The laity do not distribute Holy Communion or read the sacred scriptures during the Holy sacrifice. This is why the priest is ordained!

The congregation follows the Mass silently and reverently with their missals which translate the words of the priest. The gestures of the priest are reverent, restrained and include many genuflections out of reverence for the true presence of Jesus Christ is the Blessed Sacrament! The text and rites of the Traditional Latin Mass are exactly the same throughout the entire world! They do not vary from priest to priest or church to church.

The Latin Mass emphasizes self-denial and awareness of sin. There are many references to atoning for sin, hell, judgment and the intercession of the saints! The Traditional Latin Mass is clearly a sacrifice, as are all the Masses. It is not a "meal" as many modernists would have the faithful believe.

In the words of Pope Saint John Paul II "... The Roman Church has special obligations towards Latin, the splendid language of ancient Rome, and she must manifest them whenever the occasion presents itself..."

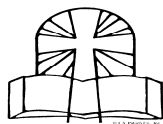

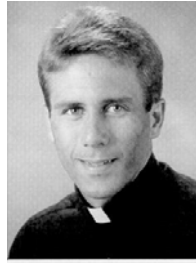

Del Párroco:

Porque la Misa en Latín?

“El lenguaje de Latín proviene una vinculo de unión que nos une atreves del mundo, una arma de ortodoxo contra todos las sutilezas del espíritu sectario, y el brazo mas poderoso del Papado...” Dom Prosper Gueranger, “La Anti-litúrgico Herejía”.

“Para la Iglesia, precisamente porque abarca a todas la naciones y esta destinada a soportar asta la hora final... esta misma naturaleza requiere un lenguaje que es universal, inmutable, y no- vernáculo .” Papa Pius XI.

“El uso de lenguaje de Latín prevaleciendo en esta gran parte de la Iglesia ofrece a la vez imponente símbolo de unidad y protección contra las corrupciones la doctrina verdadera.” Papa Pius XII

“Latin es el inmutable lenguaje de la Iglesia Occidental.” Papa San Juan XXIII.

“El uso del lenguaje Latin... es para preservar los derechos Latines... de acuerdo con la antigua tradición de los derechos Latines, el lenguaje Latin es para ser retenido por los eclesiásticos en la Oficina Divina...” Vaticano II, Sacrosanctum Concilium.

“Les exhortar a todos ustedes a levantar alto la antorcha de Latin que hoy en dia es un enlace de unidad entre la gente de todas la naciones...” Papa San Juan Pablo II.

La tradición de Misa en Latín es celebrada en el antiguo y venerable lenguaje de la Iglesia Católica. El lenguaje latín proviene una sensación de misterio y santidad. Muchas veces escuchamos que se refieren al latín como un lenguaje “muerto” porque ya no es usado en el lenguaje vernáculo en ningún país hoy en día. Pero la Misa es ofrecida en latín precisamente porque las palabras en latín nunca cambian en significado. Papa Pio XII explica: “El uso del lenguaje latín es un manifiesto de belleza y un símbolo de unidad, al igual a un antídoto efectivo para cualquier corrupción de la verdad doctrinal.”

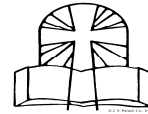
El sacerdote no mira a la congregación durante la Misa en latín, si no que se voltea hacia Cristo en el tabernáculo con el resto de los adoradores. El no hace ningún comentario espontáneo solo, más bien, recita las mismas oraciones que los sacerdotes han usado por siglos! Solo el sacerdote toca la sagrada hostia con sus manos ordenadas. Uno se arrodilla ante nuestro Rey y Salvador para poder recibir la Santa Comunión en la lengua. El laicado no distribuye la Santa Comunión o lee la Santas Escrituras durante el Santo Sacrificio. ¡Es Para eso que el sacerdote es ordenado!

La congregación sigue la Misa en silencio y reverentemente con sus misales que traducen las palabras del sacerdote. Este gesto del sacerdote es reverente, discreto e incluye muchas genuflexiones como reverencia por la verdadera presencia de Jesucristo en el ¡Sacramento Bendito! El texto y derechos de la Misa Tradicional en latín son exactamente iguales en el mundo entero. No varían de sacerdote a sacerdote ni de iglesia a iglesia.

La Misa en latín pone énfasis en abnegación y conciencia del pecado. Hay muchas referencias expiatorias hacia el pecado, infierno, juicio e intercesión de los santos. La Misa Tradicional en latín claramente es un sacrificio, al igual que todas las Misas. No es una “comida” como muchos modernistas han estado creyendo fielmente.

En las palabras del Papa San Juan Pablo II: “... La Iglesia Romana tiene obligaciones especiales hacia el latín, el lenguaje espléndido de la antigua Roma, y ella debe de manifestarlas cuando cualquier ocasión se le presente a si misma...”
